

Errata for Fitted Knits

p. 15

"Because our knitter desires a close fit, but not one that pulls across the bust, she will do 25 total increase rounds, repeating Rows 3-4 only 23 times more, for a total of 334 stitches, and **176** body stitches."

"The last section she has to worry about is the waist-shaping section. Our knitter currently has **176** stitches on the needle."

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Under *Separate sleeves from body*:

"Next rnd: **Place next 56 (60, 62, 64, 68, 72) sts for first sleeve on scrap yarn to be worked later, knit back sts, place next 56 (60, 62, 64, 68, 72) sts for second sleeve on scrap yarn to be worked later, knit front sts, place marker for new beg of rnd—160 (172, 180, 188, 200, 208) sts on needle.**"

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Under *Notes*:

Replace instructions for **SKP** with "**SK2P (slip, knit 2 together, pass): Sl 1 st as if to knit, k2tog, pass slipped stitch over.**"

Under *Lace Panel Pattern*:

Replace all instances of "**SKP**" with "**SK2P**".

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Under *Drop-Stitch Lace*:

"Rows 1, 3, and 5 (WS): p1, *k2, p2, k2, p3; rep from *, end **k2, p1.**"

"Rows 7, 9, and 11: p1, *k2, p3, k2, p2; rep from *, end **k2, p1.**"

Insert after *Drop-Stitch Lace* section and before *Front*:

"**Note: When working Row 6 of drop-stitch lace pattern before transitioning to a ribbed section, to keep ribbing pattern correct, work this row as: k1, *p2, k1, drop the next st down to the yo, k1, p2, k2; rep from *, end p2, k1.**"

When dividing front for neck opening, count stitches as if the yarn overs (stitches to be dropped) are not there."

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"Rnd 26: Rep Rnd **22**—93 (97, 105, 111, 117) sts."

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Schematic should show sleeve length from underarm, not from shoulder.

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"Row 1 (RS): k1, yo, k1, place marker, **yo**, k6, yo, k1, place marker, yo, k20, yo, k1, place marker, yo, k6, yo, k1, place marker, yo, k1—46 sts."

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Replace first "**X-Large**" label with "**Large**".

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"Rows 24 and 26: Rep row **22**—26 (30, 32, 38) sts."

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Under *Front*:

"Row 12: Rep Row **8.**"

Under *Eyelet Border*:

"Rows 12-15: Work in garter st, dec **1** st at beg of each row—25 sts."

Schematic shows total length, not length from underarm.

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Under *Collar*:

"With larger needle, cast on **62 (66, 70, 74, 78)** sts. Do not join.

Rows 1-10: KFB in first st, work in seed st to end—**72 (76, 80, 84, 88)** sts."

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Under *Center Back Decreases*:

"**Row 8: Knit.**

Row 10: Rep Row 2—109 (117, 125, 131, 137) sts.

Row 11: Purl."

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Schematic shows total length, not length from underarm.

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Under *Front Neck*:

"Rows 10-13: Work even.

Rep Rows 4-13 twice more—16 (16, 18, 18, 20, 20, 20, 22) sts."

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Under *Back Neck*:

"Row 1 (RS): Work **27 (29, 29, 31, 31, 33, 37, 39)** sts, place rem 17 (17, 19, 19, 21, 21, 21, 23) sts on stitch holder to be worked later.

Row 2: Bind off **10 (12, 10, 12, 10, 12, 16, 16)** sts, work to end."

Schematic shows cross-shoulder width on front and back, not neck width.

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"With smaller needle, cast on **108 (108, 108, 120, 120)** sts."

Under *Divide Back and Front*:

"Bind off **9 (9, 9, 15, 15)** sts. Work ribbing patt over next 12 sts, **k21**, work ribbing for 12 sts, bind off **9 (9, 9, 15, 15)** sts, work ribbing patt over 12 sts, **k21**, work ribbing for 12 sts. **You are left with two sets of 45 stitches each. Place one section of stitches onto a stitch holder or length of scrap yarn to be worked later. Work front on second section."**

Under *Front*:

"**Row 1 (WS):** sl 1, p2, k3, p3, k3, p to last 12 sts, (k3, p3) twice.

Row 2 (RS): sl 1, k2, p3, k3, p3, k1, LLI, k to last 13 sts, RLI, k1 (p3, k3) twice.

Rep Rows 1-2 14 (17, 20, 22, 25) times more—75 (81, 87, 91, 97) sts. Place front sts on a length of scrap yarn."

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Under *Side Slits*:

"Set-up rnd: [Knit to marked st, **purl marked st**] twice."

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
Under *Back Hem*:

"Rows 41-47: Work 2 tog, work in seed st to last 2 sts, work 2 tog—**77 (81, 85, 89, 93, 97)** sts."


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"Back dart dec rnd: Work front even, knit to **3 sts** before center back marker, SSK, k2, k2tog, knit to end."

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Under *Gauge*:

"Skirt

16 sts and 22 rows = 4" (10cm) in St st"
